The book of Lamentations...

- The book written after Babylon's destruction of Jerusalem around 586BC does not expressly mention its author but is traditional attributed to Prophet Jeremiah the weeping prophet who witnessed the destruction of Judah. (2Chronicles 35:25)
- Lamentations carries a central theme of sorrow and hope revealed in five poems of lament that highlight the result of sin and God's righteous judgement whiles giving hope in times of despair because of God's unchanging love.
- The book served as a reminder to the people of Jerusalem not to disobey God and serves as a warning of eternal damnation to us today if we live contrary to the will of God.

The Judgement of God...

- Jerusalem sinned grievously; therefore she became filthy; all who honored her despise her, for they have seen her nakedness; she herself groans and turns her face away... Lamentations 1:8
- The Lord has become like an enemy; he has swallowed up Israel; he has swallowed up all its palaces; he has laid in ruins its strongholds, and he has multiplied in the daughter of Judah mourning and lamentation... Lamentation 2:5
- How the gold has grown dim, how the pure gold is changed! The holy stones lie scattered at the head of every street... Lamentations 4:1

The Judgement of God...

God is the righteous Judge. His justice and holiness is perfect, and He has authority over all creation. God rewards righteousness, and punishes wickedness, in accordance with His divine law and moral order. In God's ability to judge righteously is a warning to the wicked and a promise of vindication and reward to the faithful.

The plea for God to restore... "Restore us to yourself, O Lord, that we may be restored! Renew our days as of old"... Lamentations 5:21
